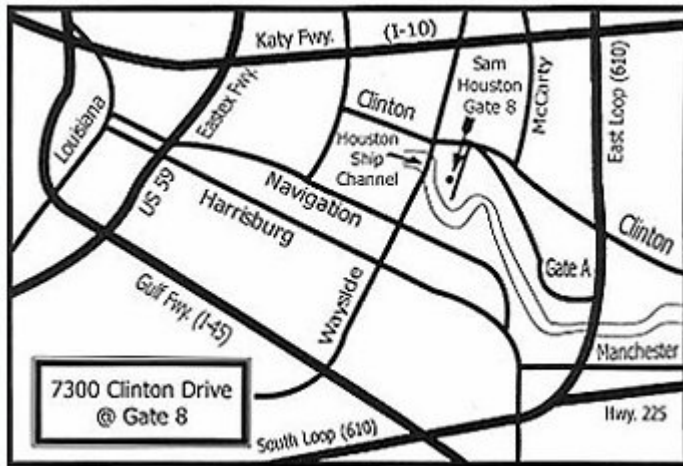
Departure is at the ship channel (see map at bottom of <http://www.portofhouston.com/samhou/samhou.html>)

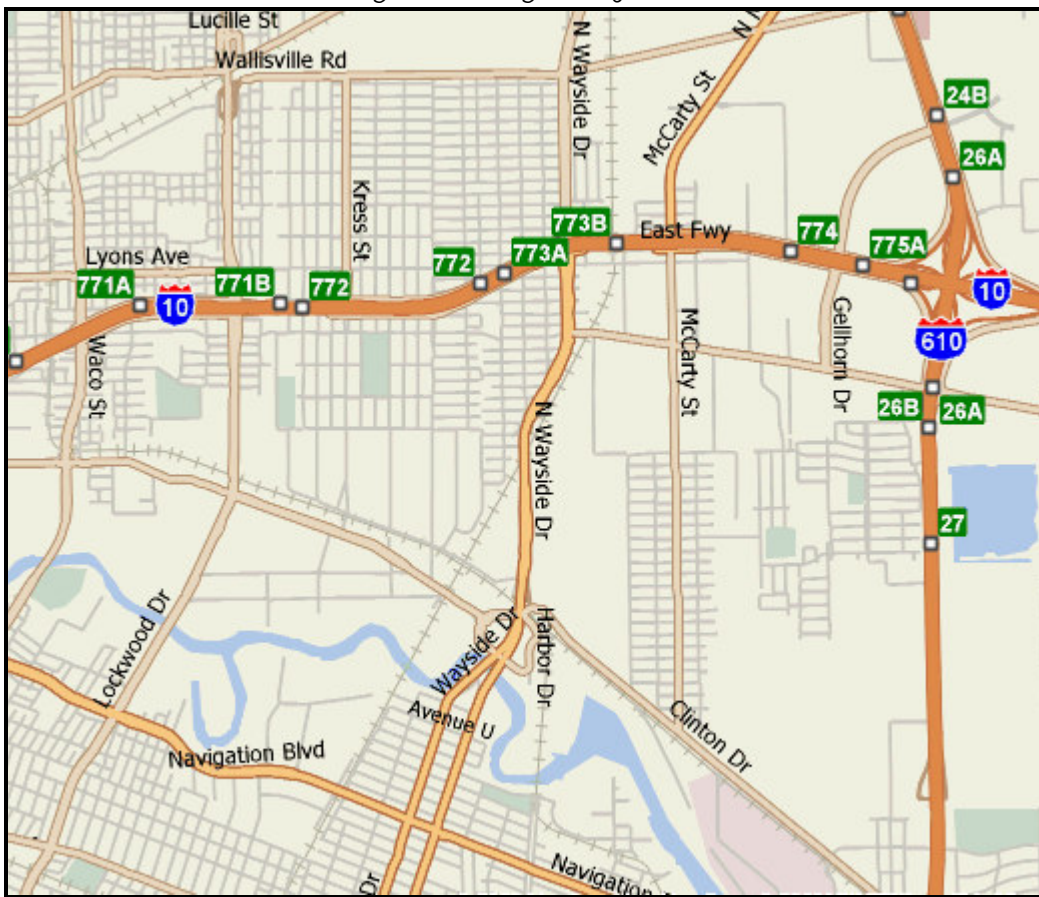

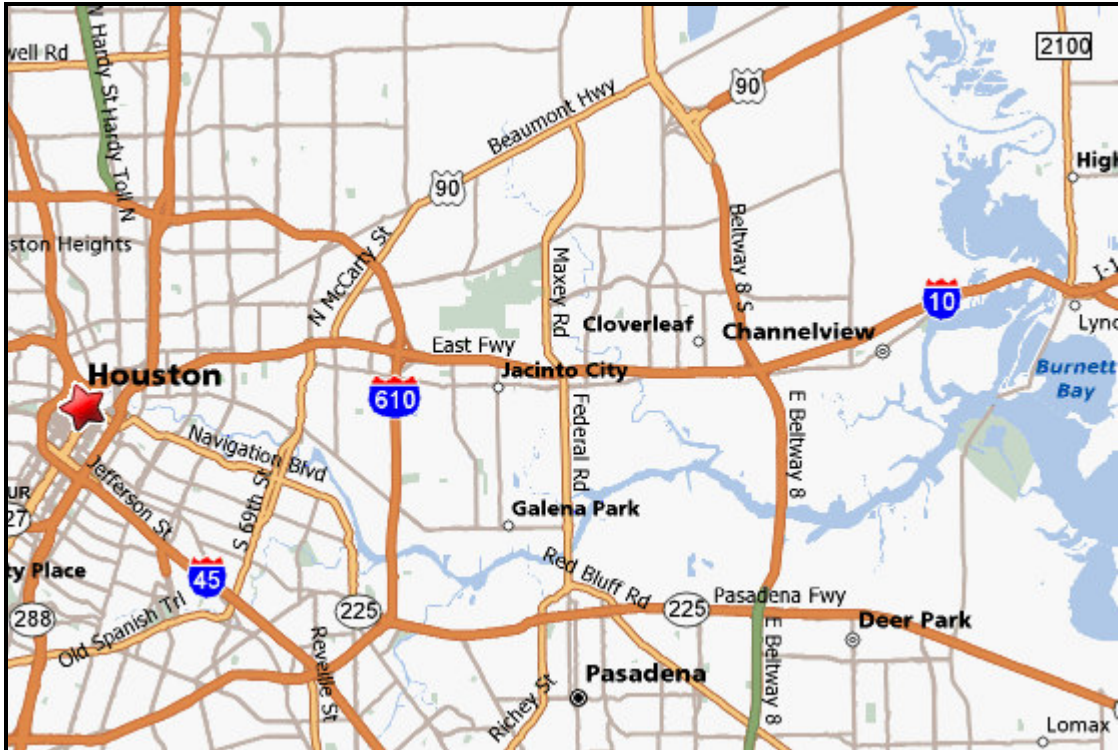
